Consolidate and develop the relationship between drawing and architectural design and understand the City as a stratification and confrontation of various chronological times.

Course Goals & Objectives (list):

Explore through drawing the imaginative and creative ability as a way to reinvent space.

Carry out graphical surveys of places, later used as information to develop architectonic courses.

Carry out sequential graphical analyses of proposed routes.

Graphic summaries.

Deepen specific design processes in Architecture through deconstructing and simulating fragmentation of architectural and, or urban objects.

Principles of organization and spatial configuration: repetition, proportion, scale, movement, variety, rhythm, equilibrium, contrasts.
